

Catheter Care Training Course

Our experienced trainers will cover a wide range of important aspects, ranging from recognising and managing complications and obtaining urine specimens to safe catheter removal and changing drainage bags with aseptic technique.

Learners will gain a deeper understanding of person-centred catheter care, ensuring patient safety and comfort while upholding patient dignity and infection control. Once training is completed and a period of competency is conducted (where necessary) learners will be equipped with the necessary knowledge, skills, and understanding to deliver high-quality care.

Course Content

Module 1: Reasons for Catheterisation:

- Understand the various medical conditions and situations that necessitate catheterisation.
- Identify when catheterisation is appropriate for managing urinary issues.
- Explain the benefits and risks associated with catheterisation.

Module 2: Complications and Symptoms to look out for:

- Recognise signs of infection, blockage, or other complications related to catheter use.
- Describe symptoms that may indicate a need for medical intervention.
- Discuss strategies for preventing and addressing common catheter-related complications.



Course Content

Module 3: Obtaining a Specimen of Urine from a Catheterised Patient:

- Demonstrate proper techniques for collecting a sterile urine sample from a patient with a catheter.
- Understand the importance of maintaining aseptic conditions during specimen collection.
- Practice skills for handling, labeling, and transporting urine specimens for analysis.

Module 4: Catheter Removal:

- Outline the steps involved in safely and comfortably removing a urinary catheter.
- Discuss patient education and preparation prior to catheter removal.
- Address potential complications or discomforts associated with catheter removal and how to manage them.

Module 5: Changing a Catheter Bag:

- Describe the procedure for changing a urinary drainage bag in a hygienic and respectful manner.
- Demonstrate proficiency in disconnecting and reconnecting catheter tubing to a new bag.
- Discuss the importance of maintaining a closed urinary drainage system to prevent infection.

Module 6: Attaching an Overnight Bag:

- Explain the purpose of an overnight catheter drainage bag and its proper use.
- Demonstrate the correct technique for attaching and securing an overnight bag to a catheter.
- Address patient concerns or questions regarding the use of overnight drainage bags.
