- Identify types of equipment that may be used in moving and assisting tasks
- Practical activities: safely demonstrate various techniques with the individual moving independently, with instruction, being moved by one carer with two carers using appropriate equipment including: lifting an inanimate object, falling/fallen clients, moving an individual forward/back in a chair, sitting to standing from a chair and bed, seated transfer from chair to commode, lateral transfers using a transfer board, using a slide/glide sheet, fitting and removing a sling and hoisting from bed to chair, chair to chair and hoisting from floor (if applicable)

Course Content

Module 1: Spine Anatomy and Load Dynamics:

• Understand the structure of the spine and its response to different positions and loads.

Module 2: Injury Types and Task Impacts:

• Explore common musculoskeletal injuries and their effects on movement tasks.

Module 3: Legislation and Company Policy:

 Examine relevant manual handling legislation and its integration into company policies, whilst keeping in mind employer and employee responsibilities.



Module 4: Risk Assessment Essentials:

• Learn the significance of Manual Handling Risk Assessments, and how and when these are put in place.

Module 5: Ergonomics in Practice:

• Define ergonomics and its application within workplace settings to enhance safety and efficiency.

Module 6: Personal Handling Plans:

• Understand the development and contents of personal handling plans for individuals.

Module 7: Personal Safety and Care:

Prioritise individual safety and care principles in moving and handling scenarios.

Module 8: Assisting Techniques and Communication:

 Using effective communication and safer techniques for moving individuals, emphasising person-centred approaches.

Module 9: Teamwork and Leadership:

• Recognise the role of teamwork and leadership in ensuring safe practices during moving and assisting tasks.

Module 10: Encouraging Participation and Consent:

• Emphasise the importance of encouraging participation, informed consent, and resolving conflicts with a personcentred focus.



Module 11: Recording and Reporting:

• Learn proper procedures for recording and reporting all moving and assisting activities.

Module 12: Equipment Utilisation:

• Identify and understand the usage of various equipment in moving and assisting tasks.

Module 13: Practical Demonstrations:

• Engage in hands-on practice sessions demonstrating safe techniques for a range of moving and assisting scenarios, including the use of appropriate equipment.
